Tales from Sri Lanka

At the Carlson Center on Monday April 1 at 7 PM

A thoroughly enjoyable two-week nature tour of Sri Lanka led to this presentation. We were mesmerized by the sounds, rhythms, diverse habitats, cultural sites, and tastes of Sri Lanka. Bird guides in Wilpattu, and Yala National Park enabled us to see beautiful sunbirds and bee-eaters, the strange and otherworldly-looking Sri Lanka frog mouth, and the Indian thick-knee. In Sinharaja Rain Forest, a protected area, we glimpsed the endangered and most recently discovered bird in Sri Lanka, the Serendib Scops-Owl. Lakshitha Pasindu Jayamannaour expertly guided us in the Sinharaja area introducing us not only to endemic birds but to the role of the local community in birding tourism. Through a pre-recorded video, Lakshitha will describe grassroots environmental stewardship efforts and bird-oriented eco-tourism.
